Assembly Instructions

Read first before beginning assembly!

- 1. Observe the assembly instructions.
- 2. Continually refer to the sketches of the individual parts during assembly.

Assembly is simple if it is carried out in a clean and careful manner following the correct sequence of numbers as shown in the sketches.

To assist assembly a knife, scissors, a small file and a brush are required. The components are to be removed from the "tree" and excess bits of plastic are to be trimmed from the cut oft point and edges with the file.

The parts are to be checked by fitting them together without adhesive before glueing. The wheels are to be carefully glued on so that they move freely. Some construction kits contain paint with which the parts con be painted as shown in the picture on the carton. Stir the paint well before use. Apply two coats of paint to the parts allowing a drying interval between each coat and allow them to overnight befor continuing assembly.

If the construction kit contains plasticine then this to be pressed in the nose of the fuselage as centre of gravity balance before the plane ist glued together. Cut out the transfers and soack them in water for a short time until tey slide off easily and then place them on the model.

Assemble and paint in a well ventilated room. Do not store in a confined space (e. g. cupboard) until glue and paint have dried thorougly.
